Replacement Value

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Fair market value (FMV) is
the price that property would sell for on the open market.
It is the price that would be agreed on
between a willing buyer and a willing seller,
with neither being required to act,
and both having reasonable knowledge of the relevant facts.
It is a sale that occurs without any extenuating circumstances.





Auction is generally believed to be the best determinant of FMV, with a few exceptions: distressed sales, shill bidding, bidder suppression or manipulation

Though no professional will ever have all of the answers, your **best protection** against **issues of liability** is to use a **transparent process** conducted by a company with an **established record and reputation**.

Replacement Value

The replacement cost is the amount it would cost to replace the donated item on the valuation date. Often there is no relationship between the replacement cost and the FMV. If the supply of the donated property is more or less than the demand for it, the replacement cost becomes less important.

To determine the replacement cost of the donated property, find the "estimated replacement cost new." Then subtract from this figure an amount for depreciation due to the physical condition and obsolescence of the donated property. You should be able to show the relationship between the depreciated replacement cost and the FMV, as well as how you arrived at the "estimated replacement cost new."


